operation to happen. Evelin can now point to herself when asked, "Where is Evelin?" and to Dorina when asked, "Where is mama?" She searches for Dorina's hand to hold. She also pats Dorina's arm lovingly, having learned to give love as she has received so much of it.

There have been noticeable changes as well in the children who Rodica works with in the state group home. Lucian who's autistic and doesn't talk much loves it when Rodica talks to him. She is the first person he looks for when the door opens, and he runs to her saying, "Let's talk!" Adriana's aggressiveness is curbed with the attention of Rodica who she calls "mama." Elec has become very attached to Rodica this past year. He was aggressive and now he kisses her. Aurica is agitated and auto-

aggressive but is calm when she's walked. When Rodica wraps her arms around her, rocks her and sings to her she immediately calms down and the spell of aggression is broken. Sweet Soledad gets admitted to the hospital a couple of times a year and you can see how beautiful she is. Pictures of the other 10 children in the group home are not allowed to be taken.

I will always thank you for providing love to abandoned babies and children, and now especially I thank you for *helping them to love*.

Vera and Dora have had a good year of getting the abandoned babies in their care to develop to the best of their potential,

feeding them bananas, cereal and yogurt which definitely helps. For example, David in this picture with Vera was a sad, sick, weak baby when he came to us. At 7 months of age, after most of his life with us, he left for a foster family happy and strong being given a wonderful foundation.
